3.2.3 (h)	"The Large Renewable Project must: be able to respond to dispatch instructions that provide for generator accountability in circumstances where generation must be dispatched off in accordance with the Market Rules. " It's encouraging to see this rule in the Draft RFP, however, it isn't clear whether the contract will also allow for compensation when dispatched off. ORA
3.2.4 (d)(i)	This section specifies the number of kilometers within which notification must be given on a large renewable project. Waterpower is very different from other forms of "large renewable energy" in that these facilities can impact negatively on many kilometers of upstream and downstream riverine ecosystem. Depending on the type of operation, sometimes over 100
3.2.4 (d)(iv)1, 2	Again, waterpower impacts on large areas and must state, "within 120 metres of the Zone of Influence of the Large Renewable Waterpower Project and the proposed Connection Line." and "every assessed owner of Property within 550 metres of the Zone of Influence of the Large Renewable Waterpower Project".
3.4.2	The maximum price for all renewable fuels must factor at the low end of the scale. The Long Term Energy Plan indicates that Ontario has a surplus of power, and is projected to have a surplus well into the future. Many families are already struggling to pay their energy bills. Rather than incentives paid for waterpower facilities to hold water back for peak demand, there should
Appendix B - Waterpower	A Registered Proponent or Group Member or Designated Team Member's qualifications, should, at a minimum provide evidence demonstrating experience in each of Planning, Developing, Financing, and Construction of at least 2 Large Complex Infrastructure Projects with a project value of at least \$10 million in North America and have at least 2 Designated Team
	There must be provision in the LRP to encourage (through incentives) not-for-profit, cooperative, community participation in all renewable energy projects. This seems to be missing from the Draft LRP.
	A portion of the total allotted large renewable energy procurement target should be set aside for not-for-profit, cooperative and/or community participation.
